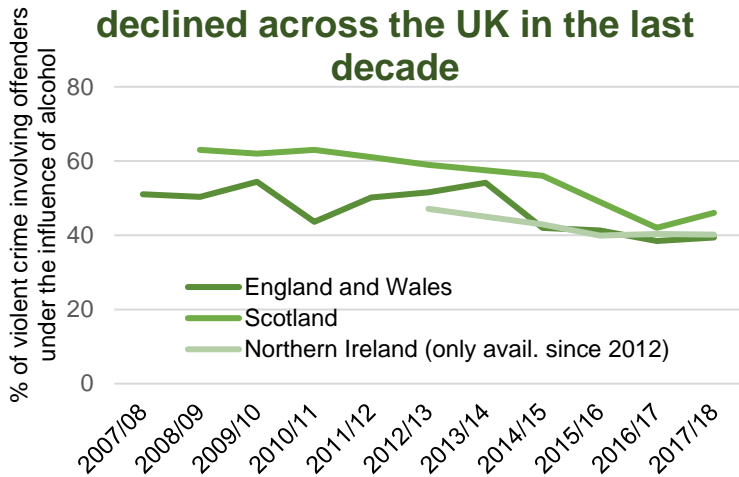


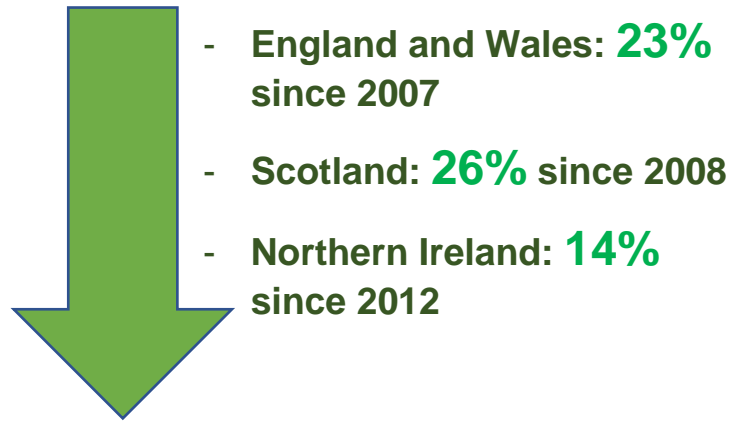
# Alcohol-related crime and drink driving in the UK

- Alcohol-related violent crime and anti-social behaviour has fallen significantly across the UK in the last decade
- The number of drink driving accidents and casualties has fallen by more than half in the past 15 years, continuing the trend from the 1980s
- Declines in drink driving casualties are most evident among young

## Alcohol-related violent crime has declined across the UK in the last decade

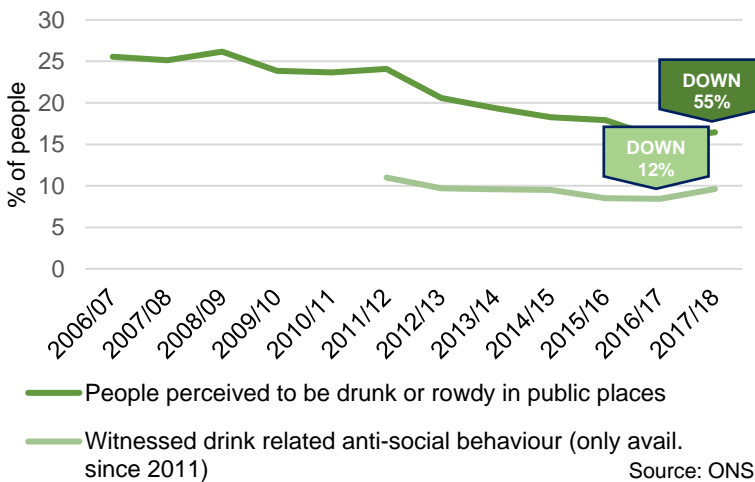

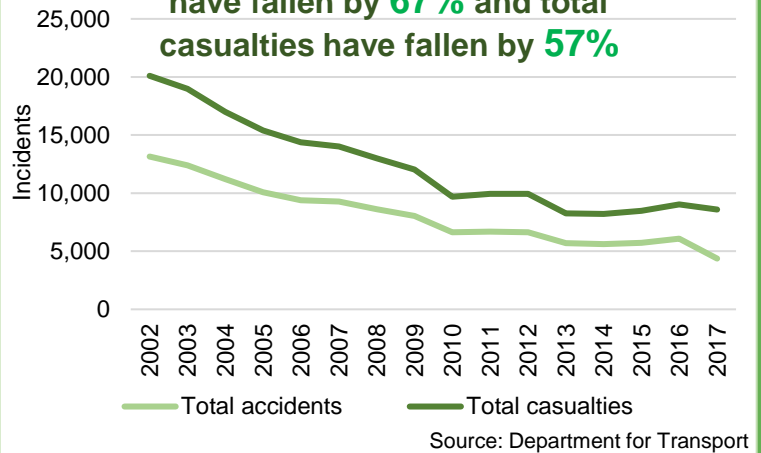

## Alcohol-related anti-social behaviour has declined over the last decade



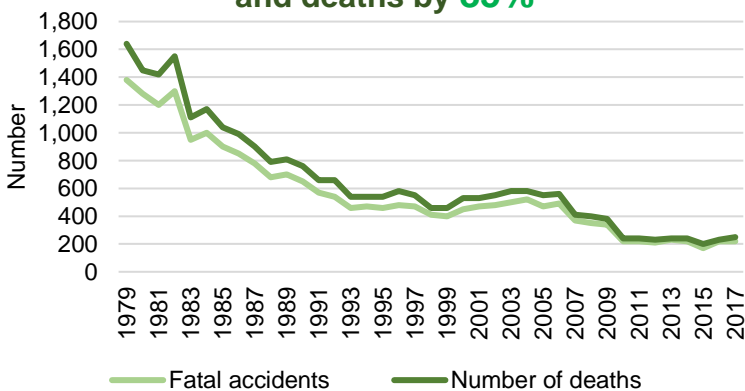

## Over the past 15 years the total number of drink driving accidents have fallen by 67% and total casualties have fallen by 57%



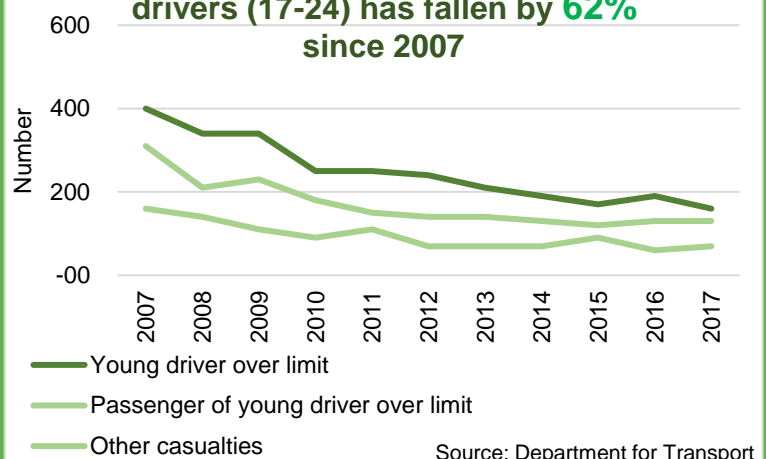
